INSTRUCTIONS: This permit application shall be completed for removing the whole tree or pruning more than 20% of live limbs, foliage, or canopy of any valued tree. Definition of valued tree: any native tree greater than 10 inches in diameter or any non-native tree greater than 16 inches in diameter. Measure diameter at 48 inches above ground or Diameter at Breast Height (DBH).

Fees: There is a \$50.00 license fee payable by check or money order. The tree permit fee is waived for removing dead trees or when responding to storm damage or emergencies (a tree permit application must still be submitted).

If you have tree work that needs to be done, please contact **Kevin Kelso 314-504-0700** to determine if you need the village's consulting arborist to perform a tree risk assessment and whether the work requires a tree permit from the village. VALUED TREE PROTECTION ORDINANCE

Summary

Approved in January, 2017, the valued tree protection ordinance helps to preserve valued trees within Grantwood Village while ensuring the reasonable enjoyment and improvement of private property. The complete tree ordinance can be viewed at: www.grantwoodvillage.com, under ordinances (Begins at Section 525.070).

The key features of this ordinance include:

- Defines a valued tree as a native canopy tree (oak, hickory, walnut, etc.) at least ten inches in diameter or any other mature tree that is at least sixteen inches in diameter when measured at 48-inches above grade.
- Removal of more than one-fifth of the crown or existing foliage of a valued tree or removal of a valued tree requires submittal of a tree permit including a \$50 permit fee and arborist report.
- Removal of a dead valued tree requires a permit but the \$50 permit fee is waived.
- All construction projects that require a building permit will be evaluated to determine if trees in the targeted construction area need to be protected during construction.
- Whenever a valued tree is approved for removal due to disease, hazard, or for an approved construction project, a replacement tree shall be planted. Valued trees shall be replaced in accordance with the direction of the Board of Trustees or Village Arborist including such replacement trees shall in all cases be of the comparable strength and structure of the removed tree.
- As determined by a village trustee or emergency response personnel, a permit will not be required when a tree is imminently hazardous to life or property or unduly interferes with utilities.
- The homeowner needs to hire a tree care company that has a certified arborist on staff to perform or supervise the removal and pruning of valued trees. The tree care company must also have an active business license with Grantwood Village. Or the homeowner may perform the work themselves when they agree to comply with the Village Arboricultural Standards (ANSI standards).
- Topping of any tree on public or private property shall be illegal. Topping is defined as the severe cutting back of limbs to stubs larger than three inches in diameter within the tree's crown to such a degree so as to remove the normal canopy and disfigure the tree.
